Completely fill out the item cost sheet. Every column should be filled in. You can use a calculator to make the calculations. Round all of your numbers to the nearest penny.

#### Poster

You need to create a poster (any size), illustrating the 7 types of items you purchased. You can get the pictures from a variety of sources, such as magazines or websites (the items on the poster do not have to be the actual items you purchased, but they do need to represent what you purchased). The poster must have the picture, store name, original price, discount %, discount amount, tax, and grand total. Be neat and creative with your poster! You may type any part of the project.

#### Assessment

- 1. Item Cost sheet: correct and complete (50 points)
- 2. Poster: title, all 7 items, labeled and neat (30 points)
- 3. Presentation: Present to the class and turn in Monday, December 1st. (10 points)
- 4. Appropriate use of technology: computer and/or calculator (10 points)
